### MORE INFO

Alberto Giacometti worked for forty years in the same studio: a 24 square metres room with a little mezzanine, located at 46 rue Hippolyte Maindron in Paris' 14th arrondissement. It was also his living space and he enjoyed its simplicity; there was no running water, little light and furniture. The walls have retained traces of his notes and drawings. By looking closely at his studio, we understand better the artist's creative work. Since 2018, visitors to the Giacometti Institute have been able to see it.

*Bust of seated man (Lotar III)*, 1965. Clay. 69.5 x 40.5 x 34 cm


*Standing Woman*, 1956. Plaster. 31 x 7.6 x 10 cm
